



PROHIBITION AGENT ID
This prop document is a replica (with some minor changes) of a real prohibition-era Treasury Agent ID card.

Enter date, name, and ID#.

Option 1: Use Acrobat form fields.

Option 2: Delete default entries and print ID card "blank," then enter information with a real typewriter, or DTP software and your choice of fonts.

Print on ivory or white cardstock.

Score at the light-colored dashed fold lines.

Trim at the edges of the brown color, and Fold on the horizontal scored line, gluing the front to the back.

Fold at the vertical scored lines, forming a spine for the booklet.

Attach a photograph of the player where indicated, and sign in the white space below the picture.
